### **DPW/Water Department** –Logan Sliter

The Village Park has been all cleaned up and ready for the summer.

Discussion followed about the crossing guard situation on the corner of West Main and Route 36 is very dangerous and the Village needs to check on the liability before they make a decision on the crossing guard. Mayor Prete is going to call NYCOM and ask for a legal opinion about the Village's responsibility, pertaining to the need of a crossing guard on a state road.

Board members agreed to continue the service for the rest of the school year and the mayor will meet with the Arkport School Board Members before Fall.

#### Water Department

Logan, asked the Village Board for approval of purchasing 20 new water meters to replace old ones in the system. With the new water meter system, we can read the CE and the ME encoders. Logan has replaced about 14 water meters and there are still 7 that need to be replaced. The old meters run out after 15 years. Williamson Law supports our new meter system and billing system.

<u>M69</u> Motion made by Mayor Prete, seconded by Trustee Matthews, to purchase 20 more new water meters. Roll call. All ayes. Motion carried.

Arkport Central School has been using water at the soccer field and have not been paying for the use of the water. It was determined by the Board members that a meter be installed for the water used at the athletic field, at the concession stand and bath rooms.

<u>Treasurer</u> – Patricia Lupo – Profit and loss reports for March 2022. General Fund income was \$3,837.50 and expenses were \$25,408.28. Water Fund income was \$17,071.86 and expenses were \$115,968.91 Capital Project Fund income was \$28,488.62 and expensive were \$2,647.38

## **Old Business & Tabled Items:**

The Village Board is still waiting to hear about the new agreement from Hornellsville Town Board to pay the rent on the court room. Trustee Brewer and Trustee Ezra Geist will request a meeting with the town about the agreement. The Village needs to know why the Town stopped paying the rent.

#### **New Business:**

Logan said that some investigation needs to be done at 4 Addison Street since the owner wants to build an addition without a permit. There is also a home on 8191 Lisman Lane to determine if there is an illegal well on the premises. Logan will give the owner a 24-hour notice before he will investigate the situation on the property.

Water meters will be read early due to system updates.
